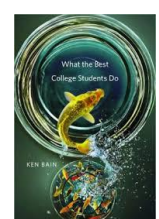
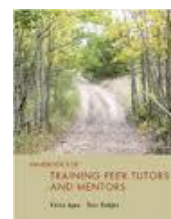
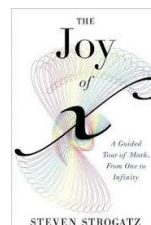
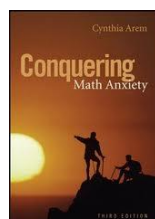
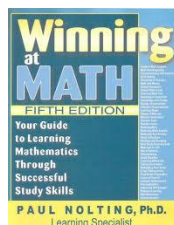
Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP)

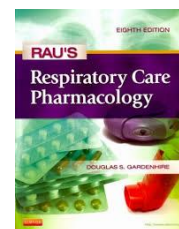
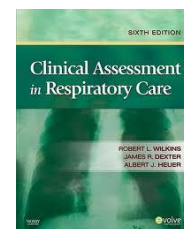
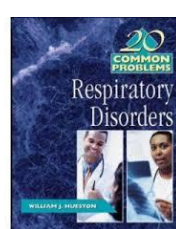
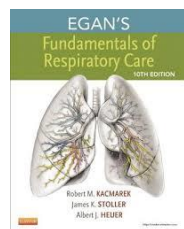
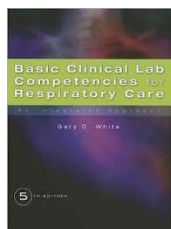
Respiratory Care Technology

The respiratory care associate degree is a sequence of courses that prepares students for careers in the field of respiratory care. The program emphasizes specialized training in areas such as pulmonary and cardiac pharmacology, patient assessment, assessment of diseases and conditions, critical respiratory care, advanced critical care monitoring, and other areas. Program graduates receive a respiratory care associate degree which qualifies them to take the examinations to become a Registered Respiratory Therapist. Students may become certified by taking the Entry Level Certification Examination administered by the National Board for Respiratory Care. To work in the state of Georgia, all respiratory care practitioners must apply and be granted a license. The only way to obtain a license is to pass at least the Entry Level Certification Exam.

Books for the Respiratory Care Technology program may be found under the Library of Congress Classification Code R in the OTC Library. The R Section encompasses all medicine, and books related to respiratory care can be found throughout. Books may be checked out for two weeks.

The library has a selection of print magazines including Respiratory Care, Chest, Asthma and Respiratory Care News, and Harvard Health Letter, among others. The magazines are grouped by topic. There is also a selection of DVDs available for checkout. DVDs are located on the first bookshelf and may be checked out for a period of three days.

GalN, or Georgia Interactive Network for medical information, has many allied health resources. GalN may be accessed through GALILEO. Visit the GALILEO home page at <http://www.galileo.usg.edu>. Off campus users will need to enter the current GALILEO password which is emailed out at the beginning of every semester. Users should locate and click on the 'Databases A-Z' tab and then click on the letter 'G' to find the database. Access is provided to a plethora of information, including full text journals, medical books and images, PubMed, consumer health resources, evidence-based medicine resources, and National Library of Medicine resources, to name a few.
