

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
## Style Guides

## **In Focus: Practical Nursing and EMS**



May is a big month in the healthcare field with the week of May 6-12 designated as Nurses Week and May 17-23 being Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Week. The libraries in Waycross, Jesup and Golden Isles have displays this month promoting these programs. According to the website, "healthcare occupations are among the fastest growing occupations."

The allied health programs at Coastal Pines Technical College are designed to assist students in gaining skills and knowledge needed to become contributing members of the healthcare community. These programs were developed to provide graduates with entry-level employment skills and initial certification in a chosen health field."

The Practical Nursing diploma program is designed to prepare students to take the NCLEX-PN for licensure as practical nurses. The program prepares graduates to give competent nursing care. Academic and occupational courses provide a variety of techniques and materials necessary to assist the student in acquiring the applicable knowledge and skills. A variety of clinical experiences is planned so that theory and practice are integrated under the guidance of a clinical instructor. Program graduates receive a practical nursing diploma and have the qualifications of an entry-level practical nurse.

Students who complete the EMS Professions diploma will be able to fluidly move into the Paramedicine program at the diploma level. Successful completion of the program allows the graduate to take the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians Advanced Emergency Medical Technician (AEMT) certification examination and to apply for Georgia licensure as an AEMT. The primary focus of the AEMT is to provide basic and limited advanced emergency medical care and transportation for critical and emergent patients who access the emergency medical system. A paramedicine program graduate possesses the basic knowledge and skills necessary to provide patient care and transportation.
