CALL TO ORDER

The Coastal Pines Technical College (CPTC) Local Board of Directors met Thursday, July 21, 2022, at 12:01 p.m. in rooms 4136 and 4137 on the Jesup Instruction Site. Ted Buford, CPTC Local Board Member, called the meeting to order.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Approval of Minutes

Upon a motion to approve by Jason Rubenbauer, a second by Jason Artie Jones, Jr., minutes of the June 16, 2022, CPTC Local Board of Directors' meeting were unanimously approved.

Board members received a handout of the College's budget report showing the actual year-to-date revenue and expenditures for the College.

Office of Adult Education – Katrena Felder

The FY23 Intergovernmental Agreement between CPTC and the Department of Community Supervision will go into effect July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023. The adult education's "Training on the Go!" program approved by the Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG) will include OSHA-10, OSHA Forklift, ServSafe Manager, Certified Nursing Assistant, Certified Construction, and Basic Shielded Metal Arc Welding certification. The College can offer these classes at no cost to those on community supervision thanks to the funding provided by Truist Bank. The program will require students to enroll in adult literacy classes as well as complete a CPTC admissions application and a FAFSA application.

Office of Economic Development – Dr. Pete Snell

Industry Ready is a concept that was developed around 13 years ago and has spread statewide under a variety of different names. It is a 1–4-week entry-level training program in a variety of industries for unemployed adults or high school graduates. Employers provide input on more commonly needed entry-level skills. Dr. Pete Snell is assisting TCSG in developing a single branded program to be advertised statewide.

CPTC Campus Police Chief, Ethan Johnson, attended the FBI National Command Course in Quantico, Virginia last week. This class is designed for chiefs and sheriffs across the nation whose departments have fewer than 50 officers. In this training, the FBI shared their aid and information concerning their Hostage Rescue Team, ballistics research, forensics lab, and free training opportunities. The CPTC Campus Police Department is looking forward to partnering with them more in the future.

Office of Special Projects – Eva Byrd

The College had a total of 11 students from Ware, Pierce and Camden counties, plus one home-schooled student, participate in the Summer Internship program. With the June Local Board meeting being held in Hazlehurst, the Summer Interns couldn't join us this year. Dr. Michael-Angelo James was the class-time instructor. The students took the EMPL1000 course where they learned skills that help make them better employees, including mock interviews with instructors and administrators on campus. The interns also learned how to be a good employee while working in various areas on campus. The staff they worked with were great in providing them with constructive feedback; and the students enjoyed the interaction.

Office of Student Affairs – Karla Nordone

As of June 28, the College has 1,486 students registered for Summer semester. Enrollment for Summer 2021 was 1,584. There are 185 dual enrollment students enrolled, which is down 11 students or -5.61% from last Summer semester.
